
National Policies and Measures for Combating SDS

A. Major National Activities

- ✓ Establishment of the National and Provincial SDS Management Committees
- ✓ Identification of Dust Sources in the country
- ✓ Assessment of environmental and economical damages of dust storms in 6 of provinces.
- ✓ Preparation of national action plan to combat SDS.
- ✓ Preparation of a national adaptation plan to combat SDS.
- ✓ Allocating over 400 million Euro over the past 5 years and implementation of dust management measures in 25 provinces (2017 to 2020)

Dust in Iran

According to dust origin identification study in the country in 2018, about 34.6 million hectares of the lands in Iran (21% of total area) are origins of dust with various intensities and these areas have the potential to produce more than about 4.2 million tons of dust per year








Identification of the regional dust sources




